


Artisanal hand-made gift for Employees at an event



1. Scope of Work

The project's primary aim was to create a utility pouch that harmoniously combined a modern aesthetic with traditional Indonesian craftsmanship, showcasing the nation's rich flora and fauna. Customized with the client's logo, the pouch was elegantly packaged in a premium gift box. The project also had a significant focus on uplifting local beneficiaries in Indonesia, with an emphasis on incorporating traditional regional styles to resonate with the receiving audience, making it a truly meaningful and impactful endeavour.

2. How we do it :

Market for Good collaborated with an Indonesian social enterprise vendor to create a stunning hand-stitched utility pouch, drawing inspiration from one of their best-selling product lines. The pouch was thoughtfully designed, featuring a batik print that beautifully portrayed Indonesia's flora and fauna, complemented by a logo deboss on thick leather for a modern touch. What made this project exceptional was its engagement of women artisans from a remote Indonesian island for batik print design, while male artisans handled leather debossing and stitching, showcasing the spirit of collaboration and diversity in crafting this unique product.

3. Why we do it :

By participating in this endeavour, they've secured livelihoods for themselves and their families, contributing to their economic well-being while preserving their cultural heritage.
